Follow Up - Writing Activity:

Give the student the writing worksheet. Tell student that the pictures tell a story, but are not in order. Ask the student to decide what the sequence is and number the pictures. Have the student tell you the story out loud. Ask students the questions listed below and prompt as needed. Ask the student to write their story on the lines provided using their best writing skills.
